### Explanation of Technology Sessions:

**The Walsworth Technology Kit with Kim Zahner:** Kim will be presenting a session on Planning, Creating, Submitting and Proofing materials along with a thorough presentation of the '06 Walsworth Tech. Kit Material. This is a great hands on session for all advisors, as well as any students who will be working alongside advisors submitting pages to Walsworth.

**Photoshop and InDesign with Russell Viers:** Russell will be dividing his presentations based on level of experience with the programs. He will be offering "Beginning Photoshop and InDesign" on Friday afternoon - Saturday morning and then "Intermediate Photoshop and InDesign" on Saturday after morning snack - Saturday afternoon. In addition, we are luck enough to have Russell back for a third session on Sunday morning. He will be offering an Advanced Design class in Photoshop and InDesign.

\*\* Here at ASL we are using Adobe Photoshop and InDesign CS2. If you plan to work on files in these training sessions that you would like to take back with you to your schools for further work, I strongly urge you to bring CDs or DVDs with you to burn. In our HS Computer Lab, where Russell will be working all weekend, we have CD and DVD burners on our G5 machines. Additionally, you can bring any sort of external storage device to transfer files.

It is also worth noting, if your staffs take advantage of their time to work on theme development in the HS Journalism Lab on Saturday afternoon, there they may create files they would like to take back with them for further development. Here again some sort of file transfer system will be invaluable (CD, external hard drive, iPod, etc.). Last year the ASL staff worked on design in one of our sessions that became the foundation for our entire yearbook theme! Also, if you do plan to have staff members attend our swap shop and theme development session, please bring 3-4 copies of last year's yearbook with you!
